The publication of the Du Peyrou-Moultou edition of his collected works appeared in 1782, and made available to the public for the first time many of his autobiographical writings and later political works, as well as letters, fragments, and other shorter works. Hobbes wrote several versions of his political philosophy, including The Elements of Law, Natural and Politic (also under the titles Human Nature and De Corpore Politico) published in 1650, De Cive (1642) published in English as Philosophical Rudiments Concerning Government and Society in 1651, the English Leviathan published in 1651, and its Latin revision in 1668.
