Child Protection | Family Violence Law Help. Child protection is about the laws that deal with making sure that children are safe and well cared for. It covers things like what happens when there are concerns that children are at risk, when children can be removed from their family, or returned.

Sometimes, the Department can remove children and start legal action if they think it is necessary to protect children from domestic and family violence. This is because of the negative effect that domestic and family violence can have on a child's safety, wellbeing and development.

(a) "Violence against women and their children" refers to any act or a series of acts committed by any person against a woman who is his wife, former wife, or against a woman with whom the person has or had a sexual or dating relationship, or with whom he has a common child, or against her child whether legitimate or illegitimate, within or without the family abode, which result in or is likely to result in physical, sexual, psychological harm or suffering, or economic abuse . . .

Child Protection and domestic violence. When you are a victim of domestic violence, it can lead to your children being at risk too. They may be either physically hurt themselves and/or they may witness domestic violence which can be very emotionally harmful for children.

The National Guidance for Child Protection in Scotland 2014, states that the impact of domestic abuse on a child should be understood as a consequence of the perpetrator choosing to use violence rather than of the non-abusing parent's/carer's failure to protect.
