Employer and Tax Information - Texas Secretary of State

Liable employers report employee wages and pay the unemployment tax based on the Texas Unemployment Tax Act. Wages are reported when they are paid rather than when they are earned or accrued. Employers report employee gross wages each quarter and pay taxes on the first \$9,000 per employee, per year.

Social Security tax withholding of 6.2% up to annual maximum taxable earnings or wage base of \$137,700 as of 2020 2. Medicare tax withholding of 1.45%. Additional Medicare tax withholding of 0.9% for employees earning over \$200,000, a tax withholding requirement that began in 2013 3. State income tax withholding.

Tax Information Income Tax Withholding Federal Income Tax Withholding on Wages. As employers, state agencies and institutions of higher education must deduct federal income tax (FIT) from wages of a state officer or employee.FIT is computed based on current tax tables and on the designations and exemptions claimed by the employee on his or her W-4 form.

Calculate state unemployment tax. The Texas Workforce Commission advises the employer of its SUTA tax rate for the year. For 2010, the minimum rate was .72 percent and the maximum was 8.60 percent. New employers generally have a rate of 2.70 percent or the average industry tax rate--whichever is greater. The SUTA wage base for 2010 was \$9,000.

Beginning January 1, 2013, employers are responsible for withholding the 0.9% Additional Medicare Tax on an employee's wages and compensation that exceeds a threshold amount based on the employee's filing status.

Employment Tax Due Dates. You must deposit and report your employment taxes on time. Correcting Employment Taxes "X" forms are used to report adjustments to employment taxes and to claim refunds of overpaid employment taxes. There are several additional ways to address adjustments to the employment taxes you reported on your return.

Every employer engaged in a trade or business who pays remuneration, including noncash payments of \$600 or more for the year (all amounts if any income, social security, or Medicare tax was withheld) for services performed by an employee must file a Form W-2 for each employee (even if the employee is related to the employer) from whom:

Some employers elect to pay the entire 15.3% themselves and not withhold taxes from the employee. You'll must also pay 6% federal unemployment tax (FUTA) on the first \$7,000 a year paid to your employee, but you might be eligible for a credit of up to 5.4% if you also pay state unemployment taxes.
