Guided Reading Question Cards. During guided reading, I may be reading with one student while the other members of the group are reading independently at the table. Reading Activities for Any Book — Literacy Ideas

Read a book or text to the class, and model your thinking and questioning. Emphasize that even though you are an adult reader, questions before, during, and after reading continue to help you gain an understanding of the text you are reading. Ask questions such as: "What clues does the title give me about the story?"

How to Answer Reading Comprehension - tips to increase ...

Pre-reading prepares students for learning by activating their prior knowledge about the topic featured in the text. During-reading strategies teach comprehension by making connections, generating questions, and determining importance by guiding the reader to use proficient reader strategies.
